## Fadi Nicolas, M.D.

### “The Neurobiology of Attachment”

This presentation will describe the basic concepts of Attachment Theory. Discussion will include the neurobiology of attachment and the implications for treatment.

Dr. Nicolas obtained his medical degree from Damascus University (Syria) and completed his residency at the University of Missouri, in Kansas City, MO.

Dr. Nicolas has been practicing psychiatry with PCSD for the past 10 years.

## Gregory McFadden, M.D.

### “OCD: Clinical Presentations, Neuroimaging, and Neurobiology”

This presentation will describe the wide variety of clinical presentations, neuroimaging, and neurobiology of OCD. Discussion will include the neurocircuitry of OCD, as depicted by functional brain imaging, and the interactions of key brain areas in contributing to OCD symptoms.

Dr. McFadden graduated Dartmouth College with Distinction in Physiology Psychology. He then traveled to the Aloha state where he obtained his MD degree and a Ph.D. in Physiology from the University of Hawaii. After his residency at John Hopkins Hospital—and Chief Resident in his senior year—he completed post-doctoral research fellowships in cardiology at Queens Medical Center and psychopharmacology at John Hopkins Medical School in Baltimore.

Dr. McFadden has been practicing psychiatry with PCSD for the past 24 years.

## Timothy A. Murphy, M.D., DFAPA

### “DSM-V Update: A Preview: Changes, Challenges, and Controversies”

This presentation will explore the scientific basis for proposed changes to DSM, the current controversies involving the proposed changes, and discussion of important, new diagnostic constructs.

Dr. Murphy obtained his medical degree from Dartmouth Medical School, completed his residency at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center, Hanover, NH, and awarded Distinguished Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association.
